CIP News

Mother Nature has been good to us during the month of December permitting work to continue virtually uninterrupted at the Club. The work around the pool has been focused on finishing the storm drain system and on raising and completing the fine

grading of the deck area. Our electrical contractor is currently trenching to bring power out to the pool area for lighting.

Within the locker room wing, a new concrete floor has been poured in each of the bathrooms covering up the new sewer lines that were previously installed. The floor in the mechanical room was raised by approximately 6" to match the floors in the adjacent rooms. We were requested by our general contractor to engage the services of a structural engineer to advise us on upgrades that should be done to the locker room wing since all the walls have been exposed down to their studs. Based on the engineer's recommendations we have moved forward to add anchor bolts to the foundation, replaced several walls that could buckle in a major earthquake and we are adding plywood sheer walls to a number of areas within the building.

In January we will continue to work within the locker rooms to complete the structural upgrades, add insulation, start on additional plumbing work and install electrical circuitry. We should complete the exterior electrical work, the fine grading and hopefully begin the installation of the pool and spa tile.

Lastly and of direct impact to Club members is work that is needed to replace the fencing on the north side of the backcourts. This work is scheduled to begin on Monday, January 14th. This closure of courts #5, 6 and 7 will last for approximately 10 days. Court 4 will be available for some instruction and/or ball machine use. During this time our tennis court contractor will take down and replace the entire section of fencing. See back page for diagram.

Once the old fencing is removed, the contractor will bore new holes into the concrete retaining wall, cut the corner on a 45° angle, pour a new retaining wall to support the new angle, set the new poles, add a new gate between courts 6 & 7, and hang new fence fabric. Weather should not adversely impact this work, so we hope that it will be completed on schedule. We are sorry for the inconvenience this will cause our regular tennis players, but this is necessary work that must be performed at this time.

Please keep tabs on our daily progress via our web cam (www.ptctennis.com/courtcam). We do apologize as the camera was out of operation for a couple of days this past week as the router at the Club failed and had to be replaced.
