We expect a very busy summer at the PTC. We have many new families and the number of kids will be the highest we have ever had. We need everyone's cooperation and understanding to make sure it is a safe and fun summer.

Printed in the front of the 2008 Club Roster is a listing of the Club Rules. While rules tend to take the fun out things, they are the rules that our Club has and we ask that all our members abide by them. Those that are of the most concern during the busy summer months include:

General Rules:

- Unsupervised children under age 10 are not allowed on the premises at any time
- No one under the age of 18 may;
 - remain at the club after closing time (6pm summer hrs. June 16th - Aug 17th) (5pm non-summer hrs.)
 - use the fitness facility at any time
 - · possess a key to the Club
 - access or use the main clubroom unless supervised
- Members must sign in their guests upon arrival

- Group parties where non-members will be attending must be approved in advance by the club manager
- Be considerate using cell phones when at the club

Pool & Spa Rules:

- No one under age 18 is allowed in or near the hot tub during daytime operation hours (9am - 6pm, 7 days a week)
- Unsupervised children under age 14 are not allowed in or near the pool or spa at any time
- Food and beverages are prohibited in the pool & spa
- Kids may not bring toys into the spa
- No jumping into the spa
- The spa has a maximum capacity of 11
- Parents must be attentive and responsible for their children at all times regardless of their age

Tennis

- Proper tennis attire must be worn on the courts at all times
- No black or hard-soled shoes on the courts
- Shirts (not "tank tops" for males)
- Do not walk across occupied courts
- Only water should be brought onto the courts
- USTA league teams must use 10 point tiebreak when playing matches on weekends

In addition, the rear court gate locks have now been changed and your new key will work for access to the back courts. Your old club key is now obsolete and can be tossed.

A Heritage Perspective - 75 Years This Month: Erik van Dillen



Without question, *Erik van Dillen* is the most celebrated PTC member to ever take to our courts. From Davis Cup, to #1 World Ranking, to beating some of the best tennis players in the world, our "local" kid hit the big time. Some of our older members told me that they knew this fair-haired kid was going to be a great player. As mentioned in last month's story featuring *Torry Bryant* (his Junior partner-in-crime), they played at a very high level - both on and off the courts. We had fun detailing some of their

pranks (the ones we could share that is) when they were Juniors in last month's Drop Shot, so we'll focus more on Erik's tennis legacy in this article.

Paul and Babes van Dillen became PTC members in 1950, following the arrival from their native Holland in 1945. Paul was an avid player who loved competitive men's doubles as well as sharing tennis with his wife Babes, and young sons Paul and Erik. Along with Junior pals *Torry* & Craig Zimmerman, Erik would spend almost every summer day at the PTC. They developed their tennis game at every opportunity. If they saw a group leaving a court, they would quickly run to get on and start playing. Sometimes they would only get a game or two in before "kicked off" by older members wanting to play. That meant that during the mornings and early afternoons, they would have a lot of non-court time. It didn't mean that the competitive juices stopped flowing. Besides various table games, they would create games in and out of the pool to keep busy. Back in those days, you would often see the ping pong table situated between the two old pools. Four kids would play a game and everything was in play. This meant that in order to reach an angled shot, one of the defenders would literally have to fly in the air trying to return the shot - usually landing in the pool.

They did have the afternoons to practice and many of these Juniors really excelled. Erik of course led the pack. He played #1 at Burlingame High School (along with Zimmerman & the Cookson boys) where they routinely won the CCS under Coach Jack Darrah. At that time, Erik was rated #1 in NorCal and had the chance to showcase his stuff at the National Junior Hardcourts held each year at the PTC. His play was legendary as he won national championships in every age division – the 12's, 14's, 16's, & 18's.

Erik says that hosting the Hardcourts is what set the PTC apart from any other club. If you read the historical prospective articles during the last three months, you'll notice that a common thread between *Erik*, *Bob & Betty Cookson*, *John Schroeder and Torry Bryant* was the

importance of the Hardcourts to the PTC. Everyone in the club participated in one way or the other. It was the one time of year when they were in the national spotlight. To illustrate the caliber of young players the Hardcourts brought in, Erik and I concluded that there were seven participants who are now in the Tennis Hall of Fame (Stan Smith, John McEnroe, Jimmy Connors, Pete Sampras, Michael Chang, Billy Jean Moffit (King) and Rosie Casals). Together, this group has won 98 Grand Slams and nearly 700 ATP tournaments. This doesn't even count the Davis Cup or Wrightman Cup victories.

From Burlingame, he went to USC where he played #1 singles & doubles on the #1 team in the country. There were a couple seasons where the team didn't lose any matches during their dual meets – unbelievable but true. After USC, Erik went to the business school at USF. He soon turned pro and had a great career. Erik won one pro singles title and seventeen doubles titles. He has even beaten six #1's in the world.

His claim to fame however came in Davis Cup play. He played doubles with Stan Smith (1971-1973) on the team that lost to the Romanians in 1971 (3-2) in North Carolina. The next year brought a rematch with the Romanians - this time in Bucharest. This was the 1st time in 35 years that a Davis Cup final had been staged in Europe, since the U.S. & Australia has so dominated the Cup play. John Davis, grandson of Dwight Davis and founder of the Davis Cup was at the match and said, "it was the most exciting and most emotionally charged tennis match I've ever seen. The place was filled and all the Romanians were just screaming. It was a soccercrowd mentality. Stan Smith, with that big. booming serve, had to wait up to 30 seconds for his second serve. There was too much noise." The U.S. team encountered a host squad that made sure its linemen were corrupt and ready to help the home team win. Added intrigue was the ultra-tight security due to Cold War tensions and the death threats to America's Jewish players, Harold Solomon and Brian Gottfried. The match took place one month after the 1972 Munich Olympics where 11 Israeli athletes died.

After losing to the Elie Nastase in doubles with

Smith in 1971 Cup play, the Romanian papers quoted Nastase and partner Ion Tiriac in saying that Stan Smith will not see a ball hit his way. Hall of Famer Jack Kramer caught up with Erik the night before the big match and gave him a little advice. He told him to go out and take charge and don't wait for Stan to take the lead. Erik said that he used the advice to help them beat Nastase/Tiriac 6-2, 6-0, 6-3 and the U.S. to beat Romania 3-2. The next year, Erik/Smith and the U.S. Davis Cup team lost to Australia. That team featured two of the best players ever in Rod Laver and Don Newcombe. Erik calls Rod Laver the best player he ever faced. In more recent players, Erik gives the nod to Roger Federer as being the best all-round tennis player.

Today, Erik is the founder of van Dillen Partners, Inc. a sports marketing firm. Prior to that, he worked for IMG for twenty years. Erik currently sits on the Board of Directors at the PTC. On June 7-8, the club is hosting the always-popular van Dillen Men's Doubles Championship and the newly named van Dillen Women's Doubles Championship. This will be the 34th year that the van Dillen Tournament has been played at the PTC. The tournament got its start in 1974 with the gift to the Club of the "van Dillen Cup Trophy" from Babes, Paul Jr. and Erik, in loving memory of Paul van Dillen Sr. Erik discovered the exquisite, handcrafted silver "van Dillen Cup Trophy" during one of his tournaments in London. The van Dillen Cup resides in the PTC clubhouse and the tournament winner names are inscribed on its base. The tournament winners embody the highest level of tennis competition and sportsmanship within the Peninsula Tennis Club. The van Dillen Doubles Championship Tournament Cocktail Party is Saturday evening. June 7th. All members are encouraged to attend the party. Please see Social News for additional info.
