Finally as a reminder, on the 10/1 statements many snack bar charges from early July will appear dated in mid and late July. Our POS system experienced some malfunctions, and these charges were re-posted manually later in the month.

### **CIP** News

Like an iceberg, much of the work currently going on at the Club is going unseen to those watching via the web cam or from the Clubhouse.

We broke ground on our long awaited Capital Improvement Project (CIP) in September. A hole was cut into the exterior and interior fences to permit equipment to enter our property. Heavy metal plates have been placed across court #2 to protect it from the trucks that will be hauling away the debris from demolition. The construction fences have been erected. The pine tree next to the Clubhouse & the dead Magnolia tree in our neighbor's yard have been taken down. With the exception of the hot water system, all of the equipment in the mechanical room has been removed. A temporary electrical panel has been installed to provide power to the south wing and to our contractor. The women's locker room has been mostly cleaned out of its partitions. Our general contractor has completed converting the old storage room to a base operations office. This is one of those little innocuous decisions that saved us the expense of renting a trailer for them for the duration of the project. Both the sanitary and storm sewer systems have been mapped out to find trouble areas. A large hole was found in the City of Burlingame sewer system and we have notified them of the issue. And as you can

see from a couple of the photos, the heavy equipment has finally arrived. They are working on taking out the pools and decking. They will initially dump the debris into the deep pool and will then excavate it from there into trucks to be taken to the recycling processor.

We have been working to finalize the selection of our tennis court sub-contractor. Revised bids were requested and received back. We expect to make our final selection by the second week of October.

There has also been considerable work done with our banking partner Comerica. We are going through the needed steps to put our loan package in place. The decision by the Fed to lower rates has already had a beneficial effect on our potential terms. We will not be drawing on our loan until approximately January 2008 and we would only expect further rate reductions to help our cause.

We also continue to meet with our landscape architect to make the final refinements to our plans.
