Almost every member knows that Erik van Dillen is the most celebrated tennis player in the club. His tennis accomplishments include: playing and winning the National Junior Hard Courts at every age division -

Jeff Tateosian 12's, 14's, 16's, 18's, playing #1 singles & #1 doubles at USC, the #1 college team in the country during his four years there, turning pro and winning one singles title and seventeen doubles titles, and beating six of the then-top players at the time (John McEnroe, Stan Smith, Arthur Ashe, Jimmy Connors and Guillermo Vilas).

The pinnacle of his career however, would be his 1972 Davis Cup match with partner, Stan Smith, in Bucharest, Romania. It will long be remembered as one of the most emotional and exciting pro matches ever played, especially under the extreme circumstances they endured. The New York Times ran a front page story about the 1972 Davis Cup Team a couple of weeks ago. It still gives me chills hearing Erik tell the story firsthand. A huge "thank you" to everyone who took the time to take our Pro Search Survey. We sincerely appreciate and value all your opinions and comments, as they provide great guidance in our Head Pro search. If interested, the full survey results will be made available in *Lona's* office. However, here are a few key highlights from the survey:

Over 60% would prefer to take lessons or clinics at PTC under the right circumstances. Strongest interest is Adult clinics, especially from women members. 68% are open to more than one pro as long as there is sufficient demand to support lessons and clinics, with the future possibility of one pro dedicated to Adults and one to Juniors.

85% prefer a full-time Club Pro. Members who used "BYOP" (Bring Your Own Pro) have been very happy, but there seems to be a greater overall demand for a more permanent situation.

Member survey quote: "The perfect pro (in my vision) is involved in all tennis activities (including match making, especially with new members), and is the most popular person at the club (like a summer camp counselor). But a pro that just gives instructions (available to ALL members, of course) is OK, too, if that's what the members want."

Our next step is to finalize the job description with the Board's approval and officially post the position to the broader network of tennis professionals. Although, there have already been several applications and recommendations, we are looking to field a wide range of applicants to give the Head Pro position the careful consideration it deserves.
