1. PTC is a tennis club, please be conscious of the tennis players and keep pool noise to a minimum.
2. When entering the club through the Chatham gate, walk through the clubhouse or stop and wait until a break in play on court #1.
3. Children under the age of 14 must have an adult **actively** supervising them in the pool/spa at all times.
4. Children under 5 years old are not permitted in the spa at any time. It is unsafe for children under 5 to be in temperatures above 102 degrees. Adults have priority at all times in the spa; children must vacate the spa when in use by adults.
5. Glass is prohibited in and around pool, patio and barbecue area.
6. All children under 10 must be **actively** supervised by an adult at all times on PTC premises.
7. Running and diving are prohibited at all times in the pool/spa area.
8. Please turn off all propane tanks, close all umbrellas, turn off lights, clean up pool toys, straighten chairs and monitor junior locker rooms.
9. **Sign in all children and adult guests at the podium on arrival. Guests are limited to twice per month.**
10. **Fitness room is for adults only.**

The Board is keeping a close eye on the budget for the Improvement Project. On the front lines coordinating the logistics of the project and keeping both the contractor's & PTC's costs on budget is Stuart Batchelor. Board Members have been meeting with Stuart weekly to review progress, make design and spending decisions, and track costs to date. So far, costs of the contractor, Steve Myers, are on or slightly below budget. We have made three scheduled contractor payments to date, with five remaining, and will net out any savings in future payments. Future costs could be higher than expected but things look at this point to be on track.

For the PTC's budget, we are also running slightly below the estimate. Once again, future PTC costs could be higher than expected, so it is not nearly final. Almost two-thirds of the Contingency budget remains at this point.

We have spent about \$215,000 to date out of a total budget of \$546,145. These payments are depleting our Building Reserve Account as expected, which stood at more than \$600,000 at the end of the year. We are happy to say that we have welcomed two new members in the first quarter, more than we anticipated, and those senior initiation dues, less the payouts to resigning members, are already helping to replenish the account.
