Doris Stirm

The member with the third most seniority in the club, Doris Stirm, represents the best of the club's past.

Joining the club in 1951, Doris has seen three generations come and go. She has fond memories of the many families who grew up at the club - especially the "kids" (**Torry Bryant, Craig Zimmerman, Rob Delantoni, & Erik van Dillen**). They were all fabulous young tennis players, who only got better with time. The boys also seemed to get into mischief more often than not (*editor's note* - some things never change). She also fondly remembers seeing the likes of a few other soon-to-be famous players at the club. They included Jimmy Connors, John McEnroe, Pete Sampras, Billy Jean Moffitt (King), Rosie Casals, and Michael Chang.



Her son, Larry Preston, also grew up at the PTC. He played #2 on the BHS tennis team along with **Craig, Erik, Betty Cookson's son Bob**, and other fellow Juniors from the club. Like many BHS tennis teams in the past, they won the Mid-Peninsula League title all four years.

In 1968, Doris received her biggest honor at the club when she won the coveted PTC Award for all her outstanding contributions. She was involved with many activities during her 58 years at the club. Doris held the position of social chairman three different years, House & Grounds chairman, and she was the co-editor for the Drop Shot along with **David Kwan**. Along with the various club positions, you could always see Doris volunteering for the tennis tournaments over the years. Like most members during the days of the USTA National Junior Hardcourt Championships, she housed players, called the lines and helped make her famous sandwiches. Doris played a fair amount of tennis during her days. She also captained the Women's Inter Club teams, which played competitively three days a week.

Fellow long-time member, **Dennis Huajardo** adds "Doris was always a 'get the job done' person as well as a fun-loving and caring person. Our clubhouse definitely misses her infectious laugh. We dearly appreciate her contribution to the club that we all love."

Outside of the club, Doris is best known as an artist. She graduated from Stanford University and has studied with nationally known artists both locally and abroad. Doris has enjoyed teaching pastels, oils, and watercolors for twenty-five years in her own studio and for the Burlingame Recreation Department. She is a signature member and past President of the Society of Western Artists and is a charter member of the Pastel Society of the West Coast. Her works are a part of many private collections and has been shown in juried shows and galleries, winning numerous awards for her paintings. In 2006, she won the Art Educator Diamond Award from San Mateo County Arts Council. When asked about her passionate hobby, she said, "painting is such a joy, a wonderful therapy and a constant learning process. I feel so blessed to have the ability to see the beauty around me."

When the club thinks of Doris Stirm, we too feel blessed to have such a caring long-time member with such a rich history at the PTC. Thank you Doris for all that you have meant to the club through the years.
