USTA League - *Did you know?*

There is one new USTA tennis rule from last year that many captains may not have heard. Be the first on your block to understand it, and share it with your opponents: As you all know, if partners disagree on a line call during a match, (one sees it in and one sees it out) the benefit always goes to the opposing team. In the past, there was a possible exception to this rule if the conflicting calls came on a serve and the receiver returned the ball into play then you played a let. The new rule simplifies this. If the receiving team players disagree on a line call on a serve, the point goes to the serving team, regardless of whether the receiving team returns that serve into play or not. No let, no takeover, no argument. Point over. Keep in mind that if the serve is a let and the receiving players disagree on the call, that serve is taken over. Got it?

How about that Aussie Open! What an incredible two weeks of Men's and Women's Grand Slam tennis ending with one of the most grueling, intense, emotionally draining Men's Finals of all time. The Ladies draw had some really exciting tennis and ended with Victoria Azarenka taking her first Slam in a scream fest over Maria Sharapova 6-3, 6-0. I don't mind the decibel level but many are put off by it. I don't think you can stop it...the girls yell and play loud. Better get used to it!

In the Men's Draw, Djokovic, the No. 1 seed and the defending champion, defeated the second-seeded Nadal, 5-7, 6-4, 6-2, 6-7 (5), 7-5. The match lasted 5 hours 53 minutes, making it the longest Grand Slam men's singles final in recorded history. The quality fluctuated, and both players finished with more unforced errors than winners (69 to 57 for Djokovic; 71 to 44 for Nadal). But that was also a tribute to Djokovic's and Nadal's level of commitment and defensive skill; a reflection of the quality and risk required to strike a winner past either of these supreme athletes. Numbers do not sum up the emotional power of this duel, which deserves a place among the most riveting matches in the game's history. The exchanges in the final two sets were spectacular, with both men digging into the corners for just one more shot. Djokovic has now amassed 5 Grand Slam singles titles, well behind Nadal's 10 and Federer's 16, but he is on an amazing roll hav-

ing won four of the last 5 slams and could hold the career slam if he wins the French Open in May. 2012 is going to be good!

Someone asked me about my advice in the last issue, **ABC. Always Be Closing.** I'll reiterate...good things happen when you're balanced and moving forward.
