Manager's Corner

The Board of Directors has made changes to the rules associated with pool and hot tub use by children 14 and under.

Please see below...

- 1. Kids under the age of 7 are not permitted in the spa at any time. We are concerned about their
- exposure to the higher temperatures and their proper supervision.
- 2. Kids 7-14 may use the spa, but only with direct adult supervision. This means that an adult is in the immediate area and paying attention to the kids in the spa.
- 3. Kids 14+ may use the spa without adult supervision.
- 4. During the first 15 minutes of every hour (e.g. 1:00-1:15), both the pool and spa will be cleared and only adults may use the facility. If no adults care to use either the pool or spa, they will still be vacated. This will be the case from opening until 5:00 PM seven days a week.
- 5. During the week, Mon-Fri from 5:00-7:00 PM the spa is reserved for adult use. No kids are permitted to use it during these hours.
- 6. During weekend, the only restriction will be #4 above.
- 7. At no time may kids take toys, food, or beverages into the spa.

- 8. Kids need to be respectful to others in the spa. They may not jump into the spa, etc...
- 9. No glass containers (bottles, wine glasses, etc) are permitted in or near the pool area, the tables and chairs around the pool area, or spa, at any time. Please transfer your beverages to paper, plastic, or styrofoam cups, before entering the pool/spa area. Someone left a wine glass on a table in the pool area and it either blew over or was dropped on the decking and broke.

Your July 1st statements may show snack bar charges with incorrect dates during the week of 6/13 thru 6/19. The charges are valid and correct, but the dates may be off by several days, as we were having system problems with our snack bar

A Heritage Perspective – 75 Years

This Month:

Henry "Hank" Guilmette

If you have been in the clubhouse during the last six months, you may have noticed hundreds of photos of PTC members taken years ago. In fact,



some of our veteran members were looking quite spry in those black & whites. Our feature article this month is on Henry "Hank" Guilmette, the member responsible for preserving much our club's history as seen through his eyes.

While living in San Francisco in the late 20's, Hank began playing tennis after his father bought him his first tennis racket. As an outstanding athlete, he quickly took to the game and became quite proficient at it. He never had a national ranking, but was well known in the Bay Area and California, playing in tournaments in L.A., Monterey, S.F., Oakland, San Leandro and many more. By the time WWII began, he had won numerous local singles titles.

I spoke with two of his long-time PTC opponents and they gave me some interesting tidbits. Tom Brown, U.S. Open and Wimbledon singles finalist, as well as Wimbledon doubles and mixed doubles champion, used to play Hank at the courts in Golden Gate Park back in the late 20's/early 30's. Hank was six years older than Tom and would usually beat him, though even as a young adolescent, Tom would give Hank a pretty good game. Hank was one of the top two players in San Francisco during the 30's, winning the city championship 4 years. Tom said that they used to play for a buck and the cost of tennis balls.

Dyle Anderson, National Indoors Doubles runner up for the 45's and 65's, and Champion twice in the 80's and recently in the 85's, started playing with Tom more than 50 years ago and had many monumental matches. Dyle remembers Hank at the top of his game when one year he won the San Francisco championship early on a Sunday, then boarded a ferry to Oakland where he played in and won the Oakland

Championship that afternoon. Hank joined the PTC in 1955 when they moved to Millbrae. His wife Elizabeth was a very good tennis player and was well liked within the club. Together, they won many mixed doubles titles over the years. Besides being one of the top players, Hank was very involved with the club. Dyle remembers that he was House & Grounds Chairman one year and that he was responsible for removing the big cyclone fence in front of court #1. This allowed the spectators to get a proper view of the courts from the patio area and the clubhouse. He was also instrumental in dealing with the backcourts, upgrading the P.A. system and the Juniors dressing room area.

But what he will most be remembered for is being the unofficial photographer of the club from the 1950's through the 1980's. He enjoyed tennis of course, but photography was his love. He had a darkroom in his house and it was only natural that he took all of the photos for the PTC and for publication in the local papers. Many of the framed photos in the clubhouse and exercise room are his. *Rob Delantoni* is currently cataloging all of the photos in the clubhouse and together with *Dennis Mayer*, will create a storied presentation of the history of the PTC.

When asked how he got into photography, his son Paul told me that it actually started on December 7th, 1941. During WWII,

Hank was a civilian contractor to the military working as steamfitter and refrigeration tech on Naval vessels in Honolulu. During the morning of the attack on Pearl Harbor. he and his best friend had driven up to the top of a mountain and as they stood there enjoying the view, a half dozen Japanese fighters flew right over the top of them. They rushed back to Honolulu and Hank quickly bought a camera and some film. He knew that immediately after the bombing no one would be allowed to buy a camera or film for quite some time. He was not able to take pictures of any of the damage, (as anyone caught doing so might quickly be shot), but he was able to take and sell pictures of individual soldiers, sailors and airmen for their own use. Censorship of the outgoing mail prevented anyone from being able to tell stateside family of their location, but they could enclose a picture of themselves, not including any landmarks, to reassure their families that they were still alive and well. Hank developed the 3x4" negatives in a closet and printed them just using the 'contact' printing method with a light bulb. He sold these photos for a buck or so - and so began his "professional photographic career."

I'd like to thank Hank's son Paul for sharing his Dads' information with us. Today, Hank is 95 years old and unfortunately is blind. We all owe Hank a debt of gratitude for sharing a big part of the club's history with all of us – as seen through his eyes.
