Finance News: Steve Livingston

You will notice that your quarterly statement is larger than the last statement. This is because our new dues went into effect for the first quarter 2024 and we invoice the dues in advance. Comparatively, we went from \$495/quarter to \$620/quarter. Categorically, operations went from \$335 to \$435, Loan Reserve remained the same at \$70 (we pay it off in 10 years), Capital Reserve went from \$90 to \$115. In the meeting, I went through a deep dive into what is contributing to our costs. The bottom line is our dues have only increased at an effective annual rate of 2.5% since 2006, while our costs have greatly exceeded that. Unfortunately, we have also been hit by a large volume of repairs and water leaks.

I did benchmark PTC versus other private member tennis clubs that are similar, in the Peninsula, Marin County, San Francisco, and Berkeley. PTC is still the lowest in dues, and significantly below the average (2023 of \$348/month, or \$1,044/quarter). In addition, the PTC equity return is the only club that returns 50% of the equity, with the other clubs averaging 10%. Most clubs have abandoned equity return to help offset the capital requirements. The good news is that many years ago, PTC leadership saw the need to begin a savings plan for Capital and it has been managed.

That said, we are feeling the stress of many items, such as cracking on courts 1-3, pool issues, spa issues including multiple leaks, pool room issues, rotting beams in the main room, etc. Courts 1-3 have only been resurfaced over the many past years, with various approaches in hopes of buying more years than we got

(with the budget being the challenge). Unfortunately, nothing has changed. To rip up the courts and replace it would be very expensive. There are some newer techniques that might buy us a better return on the money. We don't know enough yet, and this is a priority to better understand in the next couple of months what the options are.

Another eye-opener when benchmarking other clubs is the staff that they have, which explains a large part of the due's differential. As Treasurer, I have benefited from getting a front row seat in the life of our Club Manager and the staff. Most clubs in addition to management have a bookkeeper, and a larger staff to help with problems. Our manager must wear many hats, including the bookkeeping, paying bills, getting the money into our accounts which is not automatic, chasing the volume of increasing broken items, making shopping runs to Costco. I have gained a lot more respect for this role. Wearing my financial hat, I would like to encourage all remaining members (about 50%) who have not enrolled in ACH, which your bill is paid by your bank, versus writing a check. It allows us to more timely collect the money and spend less time on collections. Also, please remember to sign in your guests. It is a very small fee, but in 2023, we collected significantly less in guest fees than in 2022.

Lastly, I am also the beneficiary of a strong Financial Advisory Committee and want to thank them, especially *Bryan Welsh* who has dedicated much time to our financial forecasting, and *Jen Ellison*, who has set up accounts for PTC to obtain higher interest rates. I am looking for someone who has an HR background who can help PTC with our efforts to update our policies and understand best practices. Please contact me if you are interested in helping. It would be greatly appreciated.

House & Grounds News: Kristen Pierce

The house and grounds committee has been focusing on identifying and correcting the water leak, and the hot tub is the major culprit. With the help of a leak detection company, the leaks have been identified, and a contractor has been selected to repair and re-grout the hot tub. Work should be completed by the end of January, if the weather cooperates.

The focus over the next year will be on developing the strategy for dealing with the cracks in the front tennis courts. Initial discussions with one contractor suggest that using slip sheet technology may be the best approach. This approach avoids the expense of completely replacing the courts. Slip Sheet is a special material that can withstand the expansion and contraction of the soil, something which is a particular issue in our area, and the estimated life of the courts is 20 years. A small tennis court committee is being formed, and we will be talking to additional contractors and to other clubs in the area to make sure we develop the best approach for PTC.

This year, there are additional maintenance and repairs that need to be addressed, including repairs to the pool. We are forming a house and grounds committee (separate from the tennis court committee), and we are looking for volunteers to join. Please let Kristen know if you are interested in joining.
